#### **GREAT NEWS!**

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) has officially approved Freeport High School's *Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources* pathway for the College and Career Pathway Endorsement. This achievement is a testament to the hard work and dedication of everyone involved, particularly Brittani DeVries. Brittani's exceptional effort and attention to detail were pivotal in ensuring this pathway was approved on our first submission—a remarkable accomplishment. This milestone reflects the strength of our program and its alignment with state standards, opening doors for our students to gain valuable skills and recognition as they prepare for their futures.

#### Enrollment

At the end of Dec. 2024 the district enrollment was 3741 students.

## Winter Institute Day: The S.H.A.P.E. of Equity

The next district-wide Institute day will be on Wednesday, January 22. The theme of our Pretzel Winter Institute will be "The S.H.A.P.E. of Equity," featuring Dr. Rachael Mahmood, 2024 Illinois Teacher of the Year. Following Dr. Mahmood's keynote, attendees will be able to choose from over 80 60-minute breakout sessions on topics related to equity, curriculum, multilingualism, technology & innovation, and inclusion.

## SIP Day Feedback from Staff

Staff overwhelmingly reported that the structure, purpose, and outcomes of the day were both relevant and meaningful. The data/feedback is used to plan future SIP days.Dr. Alvarado & Assistant Superintendent Susan Fumo reported on spending of the ISBE funded Teacher Vacancy Grant. Freeport planning and use of the grant funds have become a model for districts across the state.

## **Multilingual Steering Committee Update**

The committee plays a critical role in advising on the development, implementation, and evaluation of multilingual programs, aligns with the district's 2023-2026 Strategic Plan. Purpose of the meetings: Provided an opportunity for committee members to deepen their knowledge and continue to grow in their understanding of multilingual education. As the committee advances, its members are actively contributing to shaping the future of multilingual education within the district.

Next upcoming sessions will focus on **evaluating current programs**, **identifying needs**, and **finalizing a report with recommendations** for the Board of Education in May. The committee's efforts are already making a significant impact on the district's multilingual education initiatives, and we look forward to the continued growth and success of our programs.

## Program Options Task Force Update

Members: The Program Options Task Force is composed of varied stakeholders representing Banks Bergagna, Freeport Alternative High School, and SITE along with elementary, middle, and high school levels from all our schools. Both classified and certified staff members as well as administrators and parents participate on the Program Options Task Force.

What has the task force been doing?

a. Monthly meetings have allowed them to work through action steps of the project plan with intent to answer this guiding question: What program options are needed in FSD 145 to ensure all students receive a high quality education designed to appropriately and effectively meet their learning needs?

- b. Members have engaged in activities and discussions to better help them explain and understand the current state of program options for students in FSD 145. Part of that work included reviewing the historical context of existing program options with emphasis on Banks Bergagna, Freeport Alternative High School, and SITE.
- c. Concurrently, members have begun research on varied program options that include Alternative Programs, Alternative Schools, and Therapeutic Schools. District data is being reviewed and utilized to not only analyze the effectiveness of existing program options, but also identify gaps in program options for students in FSD 145.
- d. Future work for members will include opportunities to visit examples of Alternative Programs, Alternative Schools, and Therapeutic Schools. Wrapping up the first phase of the project plan will be identifying barriers to expanding program options in FSD 145.
