New ELA Curriculum



We are in our second month of implementing our new English Language Arts curriculum, HMH "Into Reading and ¡Arriba La Lectura!" in grades kindergarten through 6th. Our district wide goal states that by the end of June 2024, all K-6 reading teachers will implement HMH ¡Arriba La Lectura! and Into Reading curricula with integrity and our teachers are rocking it!

Our students are connected to the right instruction - with daily lessons that include a mixture of whole group, small group, and individual practice. Our students are being provided with a consistent standards-based rigorous

curriculum no matter where they go to school. They are experiencing writing that will help develop their cognitive skills. Student engagement has increased because they are exposed to high quality content and activities that are strong components of the HMH curriculum.

Moving forward, we will continue supporting teachers through continuous professional learning sessions, conducting learning walkthroughs, and coaching throughout the year. Teachers are participating in Teaching and Learning Cycles within their Professional Learning Communities to internalize modules and review data and common assessments to inform instruction.
