Greetings FSD Parents/Guardians & Staff,



Due to various global circumstances, districts across Illinois have observed an increase in the number of newly arrived students in recent months, many of whom are refugees resettling in our communities. In Freeport School District 145, we are seeing a growing number of newcomers from Central America, specifically from Honduras. Some immigrant and refugee students arrive in the United States with their parents, while others come with more distant relatives or guardians. Some even arrive as unaccompanied minors. Many of these newcomers are school-aged children who need to enroll in school as soon as possible, and a significant portion of them are English learners. Some may also be students with limited or interrupted formal education.

The District, in collaboration with the Bilingual Department and other departments, has been working to address the academic and emotional needs of our students while also connecting them with the various supports available in our community. We aim to connect families with community resources, assist with their basic needs, and assess and evaluate their academic placement. There is an unprecedented demand for language interpretation, translation services, and support to help newcomer families navigate the U.S. education system, and we are offering different options to remove the language barriers.

It is a great privilege to work with families and students from around the world, as they bring diverse knowledge and perspectives that enrich our district and our city. In our district, we welcome all students and strive to support them.

As we have seen the atrocities caused by war in some regions across our world today, it gives us pause to recognize the importance of coexisting in a manner that builds a community that demonstrates care and support for each other, in spite of our differences.
