The launch of "Soup with the Supt", starting with a group of students from FMS and FHS, provided me with a wonderful opportunity to dialogue with the students and to hear about their experiences as students in FSD and their impressions of their school, including ideas for improvement. Student voice generates some hard truths about how we can improve as a district. After all, they are our most important stakeholder group that we serve. I am looking forward to continuing this initiative throughout the remainder of the school year.







At last Tuesday's FSD board meeting, I had the opportunity to share the **State of the District** based on the Illinois School Report Card that was released on October 30. One of the data points that was highlighted was on chronic absenteeism.

- While the district's chronic absenteeism improved by 2% (from 37% in 2022 to 35% in 2023), we still have a lot of work to do to minimize overall absenteeism in our district. Kindergarten still showed the highest number of students who are chronically absent at 41%, which is very much close to the state average. Chronic absenteeism is defined as being absent for 10% during the school year, translating to 18 days or more, excused or unexcused. We are asking our families to please partner with our schools in helping build good attendance habits among our youngest learners.
- When it comes to Illinois School Report Card Summative Designation, every principal will be sharing their individual school information with their staff and families.
